Crayons. Markers. Pieces of scratch paper in various shapes and sizes scattered over the floor of my room or living room. This was a normal environment for me growing up; I was always creating, envisioning, and imagining. There was no coloring book untouched and no school notebook without a doodle or three. Since I could hold a pencil for the first time, I have always been interested in art and spent almost all of my time sketching.

As time went on, and I began thinking about what I wanted to be when I got older, I excitedly told my parents at the age of 11, "I want to be an artist!" To which they replied, "*Eso es muy bueno, pero eso es mas como une hobby.*" (That's good, but that's more of a hobby.) My dream was shot down and I was left wondering what to pursue, until a teacher strongly expressed their belief in my creative drive and encouraged me to really look into all the career paths an artist can go down. If time allows, I would like to use the grant to purchase my own booth at the event to showcase my art to really get my name out there and seen by industry professionals!
